automobile has it's own way of informing the driver possible maintenance issues. In the end, it is up to the vehicle owner to take care of the machine and stay safe.

Coming into a New Year, let's start with a achievable resolution:

•**Check Windshield Wiper**s (Clean your windshield and wipers. Do your windshield wipers need to be replaced)

•Check windshield Fluids (do you need to add washer fluid)

•Check Radiator Fluid (The radiator is just as important as your oil. Do you need to add antifreeze or flush old out and in with new)

•Check Oil (Do you need an oil change, is your auto leaking oil)

•Check Tires & Tire Pressure (winter driving requires good traction and the right amount of tire pressure to be safe)

•**Headlights** (check your headlights to make sure they are in working order and use them at all times for winter driving)

•Brake Lights (Check your brake lights to make sure they work and minimize the risk of getting rear ended)

•<u>Signal Lights</u> (check to make sure all your signal lights are in working order)


