Formed in 1917, Our local community-based organization meeting on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Wednesday of each month. Activities include our Farm Market, Quilting Group, Snack bar at the Middletown Fair, community service and more.



Built in the 1920's, our Grange hall is a very busy place. It serves as a meeting place for 4-H clubs and scouting troops, our own quilting circle, and community groups with interests including beekeeping, dance, and motorcycle riding.

The hall is also available for rent for private events such as birthday or anniversary parties. The hall offers two stories of meeting space and a smoke-free environment, plentiful off-street parking, and accessibility via an entrance ramp and chair lift to the second floor.

## County, State & National Granges

Plumsteadville Grange is part of a larger Grange community.

**Bucks County Pomona Grange** is comprised of the local Granges in the county (Plumsteadville, Edgewood and Middletown), and meets quarterly on the first Wednesday of March, June, September and December, alternating between the two halls. We operate a pizza booth at the Middletown Grange Fair with all proceeds going to Local charities.

**Pennsylvania State Grange** - Delegates from over 270 local Granges convene annually in October to establish policies that affect local, state and national legislation.
